HTML Document Structure and Basic Tags

Create a directory structure in your laptop storage space. Create folders for Assignment01 through Assignment16 (notice that's Assignment01 and not Assignment1). This will keep your files organized.

Create a Generic HTML webpage in your Assignment01 directory using TextWrangler. This is just to get you back into the habit of writing code.

Intro Page (index.html)

Name

Your Major / Title of the page

A description paragraph about your design practice (300 words +) well written and proof edited Add your photograph

Contact information (email address)

Link to any other design website related to your design practice

You can include a graphic title or logo on your webpage. To create the title or logo you wish you can use Photoshop/Illustrator/InDesign. Titles/logos should use a font/typography of your choice as well as some graphic treatment (such as filters or layer effects). Use File > Save for Web and post the title or logo to your page as a JPG, or PNG file.

Test your page in all the browsers that you have in your laptop. Get used to testing in multiple browsers. You should test in Firefox, Safari, Chrome, IE and Opera. Every single exercise that you will complete and every project that you will complete should be tested in these browsers in the future. If you do not have some of these browsers, you can download them for free in the following weeks.

Your webpage should the following elements:

There should be paragraph and heading text on each page, as well as other text formatting tags. At least one hyperlink.

At least one email link.

At least one image (JPG, or PNG) edited and formatted for web.

At least one list.

Properly formed HTML tags.
